Angie Pickman (7) Angle Pickman is a nationally recognized cut paper artist that combines the art of traditional paper cutting with collage to cre-ate intricately detailed works of art and animations. She received her master's degree in 2004 from Tisch School of the Arts at New York University, which is when she first learned of the art of silhouette animation artist Lotte Reiniger (1899 – 1981). Her love of nature and the tranquility of the rural terrain, as well as Reiniger's style and technique, inspired Pickman to set off on the artistic path that she continues today. Sh exhibits at galleries and art fairs nationally, does illustration, animation and design work, conducts public presentations on her art, and teaches various art classes and workshops. Most recently, he work has been featured in Mid-west Living and Martha Stewart Living magazines, and her anima tion work premiered on PBS in the summer of 2016 in the documentary "Daughters of the Forest".

Nan Renbarger (6) Nan is infatuated with fabric, colo texture, and her sewing machine

From 2-dimensional flat, straight-edged materials, she fabricates 3-dimemsional fiberscapes. She dyes, paints, and prints, layers of colors on fabrics, yarns, and threads. As she ventures forth, the notion to use her sewing ma chine surfaces and that leads to encounters with spirals, curves and loops that create peepholes for color, grottos, winding rivers o colorful texture wacky paths re flective pools, and fauna and flora of fantasy. Spontaneity is precious to her and she lets her intuition auide her to produce vessels sculptures, wall pieces and a few functional pieces.

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Margaret Rose (11) As a mixed media artist, Margare Rose transforms the ordinary into subjects that are spiritual or nature-based and topical. Her work is informed by the cycles of nature and archetypes that are shared across cultures. She uses both novel and traditional materials such as found objects, encaustic photography, and printmaking to layer image and meaning into assemblages, collages, one-of-a kind pieces and monotypes. She is currently focused on incorporating the hot wax medium of encausti into her practice and has taker several workshops by well known artists. She has traveled to orkshops in the US and abroad to hone her skills in encaustic and printmaking

Tom Schmiedeler (17) The focus of my photography has been geography in all of its intriguing and mystifying facets. I originally took photographs to pro-vide my geography students with examples of the great physical and cultural diversity we studied, particularly that which relates to the lives of ordinary people who the lives of ordinary people who create extraordinary places, and to the wonders of the natural world. Examples include image of Fingal's Cave of the Outer Heb rides, Scotland; the Shepherd of the Moorlands in the Lüneberger Heath of north Germany; the Fishermen of Nazaré, Portugal and the magic of Sami rock art in the far north of Norway. The art of photography for me has been cap turing a moment in time that best expresses the essence of a place and the lives of its people.

Celia Smith (14) Celia paints from sketches taken on the field, or from the model Landscapes animals people plants, traditional portraits and fig urative portraits of a persons life and adventures, these are called "Portraits of the Soul" and does them on commission. Barbara Solberg (17) The power of the landscape to inspire, renew and regenerate our lives is apparent in Barbara's current series of work in mixed media and soft pastels. Impressions of the nearby Flint Hills, seasons along the Kansas River where she lives and intimate views of nature are the intriguing subject matter she is exploring. Her distinctive double-sided collages combine various media with found objects

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Shala Stevenson (12) Currently employed at KU as the Marketing Creative Director at the Lied Center of Kansas. Shala Stevenson brings 25 years of expertise in graphic design to her new love of mixed media collage where her playful sense of humo (and occasional sarcasm) show through in layers of detail and unexpected depth. Inspired by her late brother, Alan, Shala's creative drive encompasses many media. In her home studio you may see acrylic paintings, origami con-tainers, digital photography, and pysanky eggs. Shala has shown her work online, in multiple Final Friday shows and most recently a the Phoenix Gallery in downtown Lawrence.
